

## Garlic Juice-Mosquito Barrier

### HELPS REPEL GEESE!

Geese, particularly Canada Geese, are very lovely and graceful when they form a V-shaped flying pattern and are heading south. A single or paired couple on a lake is also a pleasant and enjoyable sight. Hundreds of geese on your golf course, town parks, athletic fields, lands adjacent to ponds and lakes or even on highway medians are a health and aesthetic problem.

Many of our customers have asked about the dilemma caused by geese and if **MOSQUITO BARRIER®** could be of any help. I researched the matter and made contact with a MB distributor in the South who has been using MB to solve this problem for over five years now.

This is the suggested formula and the way it should be applied. The premise is that geese do not like the taste nor smell of garlic.

### Repelling Geese with Mosquito Barrier:

- 1. One Gallon of Mosquito Barrier mixed 50 to 1.  
Note the 'normal' Rate of Dilution of 100:1 so this is stronger!**
- 2. One-half Gallon of Soybean Oil, cooking Quality**

**One-half cup of PALMOLIVE Dishwashing Soap  
Don't substitute another brand, please!**

Mix together and apply to the grass areas favored by geese. Use as fine a mist sprayer as possible. Apply during the hours of 8-10:00AM, but certainly not in the hot hours of the day. Apply in the MORNING not the afternoon. Coat the areas they like to eat and rest in and apply it thoroughly. Be certain that what you mix you use that day. DO NOT store this mixture but mix a new one the next time you apply it to the grass. Don't spray the geese!

Depending on the numbers of geese, you should apply this formula every 7 days at the most, 10 days at the least. This does not kill the geese but you will see that they do not like the taste of garlic on the grass and vegetation they are eating. The geese will get the message and will move on!

\*Writing to us on May 01, 2001, Shawn Spencer, Director of Special Projects for City of New York Parks and Recreation, uses Mosquito Barrier and has had very good results with geese:

"...I Just started testing in two problem spots (one with garlic barrier and one with Mosquito barrier and fake owl with a swivel head)...The spot with just Mosquito Barrier has shown about an 80% reduction of the flock (from approx. 250 geese to approx. 40 geese) while the spot with the Mosquito Barrier and the Owl have seen a reduction of approx. 95% (from more than 300 to about 15 to 20 in two weeks)..."
